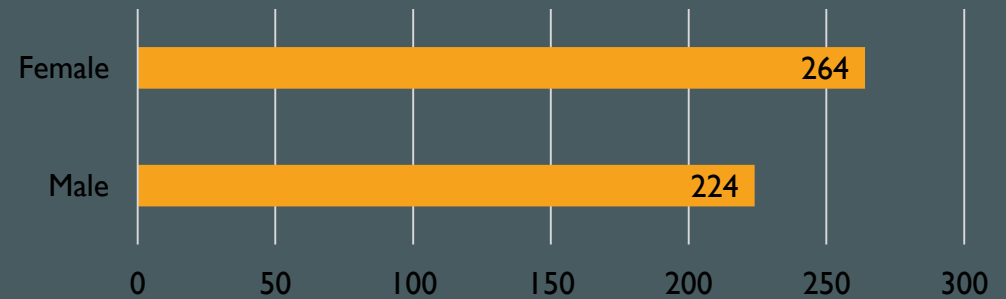

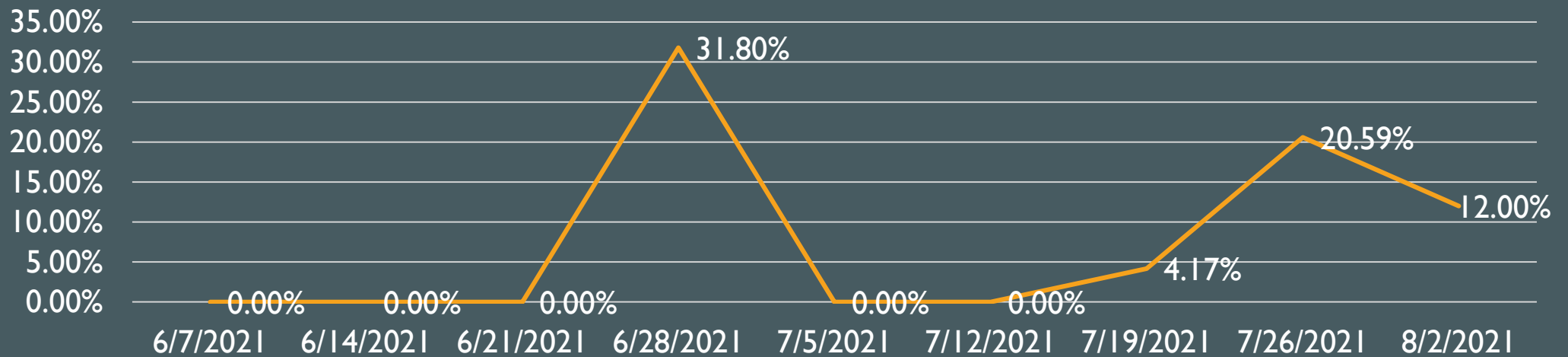

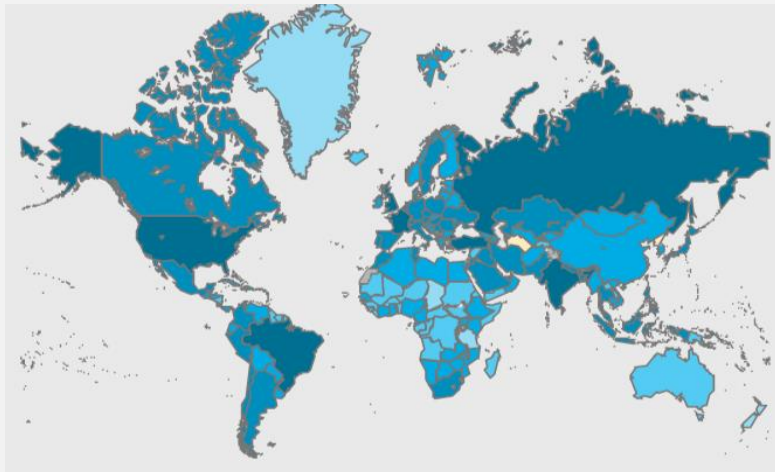

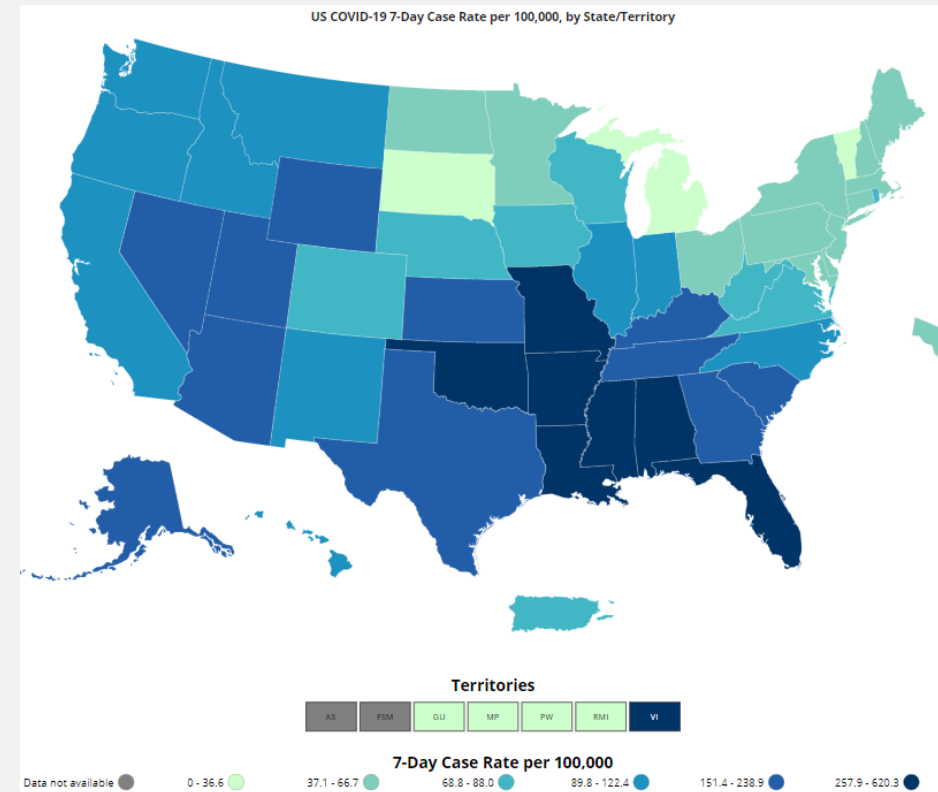

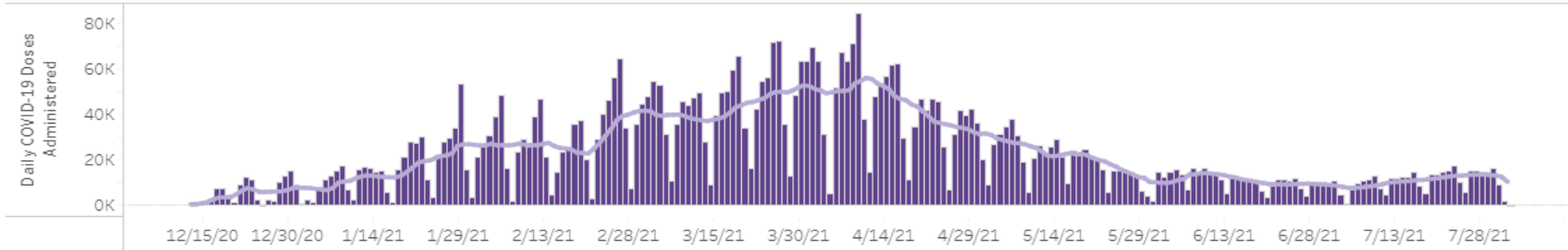

How to Enter

Missourians can enter to win using our secure online form at MOPStopsCovid.com/win. Those unable to enter online can call (877) 435-8411. We will not automatically enter Missourians who have been vaccinated. You must enter separately.

Winner Prizes & Categories

The Missouri Department of Health & Senior Services will partner with the Missouri Lottery to draw 180 winners in 5 randomized drawings who will win either \$10,000 cash or \$10,000 towards an education savings account. In total, the state will award 900 individuals throughout the incentive program.

Red Pool

Missourians 18+

If you are a Missourian 18 years of age or older and received at least one dose of a COVID-19 vaccine **on or after July 21, 2021**, you may register for a chance to win \$10,000 in the red category.

White Pool

Missourians 18+

If you are a Missourian 18 years of age or older and received at least one dose of a COVID-19 vaccine **before July 21, 2021**, you may register for a chance to win \$10,000 in the white category.

Blue Pool

Missourians 12 to 17

If you are a Missourian between the ages of 12 to 17, you may register for a chance to win a \$10,000 education savings account through the Missouri State Treasurer's MOST 529 program.

Drawing Timeline

Vaccinated individuals only need to enter one time to be eligible for all drawings that occur after the date their entry is received.

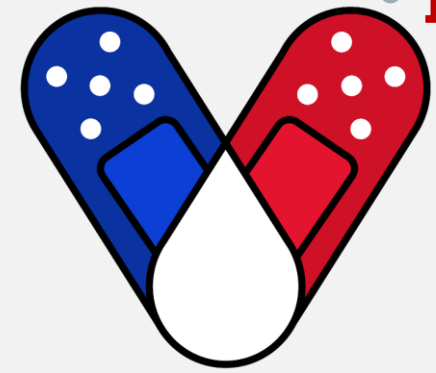

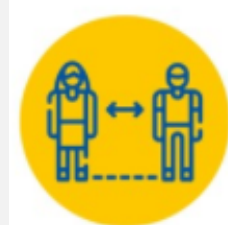

- Atchison County Health Department continues to have BinaxNOW test kits and are available for testing by appointment Monday through Thursday.
- These tests are FREE.
- The rapid antigen test provides results within 15 minutes after collecting the sample.
- This is a great option in identifying positives before going to school or work, so that we do not have to quarantine multiple people due to exposure.
