



Atchison County Cases by Age Range and Sex
















BOOSTER DOSES FOR PFIZER, MODERNA OR JOHNSON & JOHNSON VACCINE

- For individuals who received a <u>Pfizer or Moderna</u> COVID-19 vaccine, the following groups are eligible for a booster shot at 6 months or more after their initial series.
 - 65 years and older
 - Age 18+ who live in long-term care settings
 - Age 18+ who have underlying medical conditions
 - Age 18+ who work or live in high-risk settings
- For those who received the <u>Janssen/Johnson & Johnson</u> COVID-19 vaccine, booster shots are also recommended for those who are 18 and older and who were vaccinated **two or more months** ago.

- Eligible individuals may choose which vaccine they receive as a booster dose. Some people may have a preference for the vaccine type that they originally received, and others may prefer to get a different booster.

 CDC's recommendations now allow for this type of mix and match dosing for booster shots.
- COVID-19 booster shots are administered anywhere the COVID-19 vaccine is available. Individuals do not need to get their booster shot at the same location they received their initial series.



Millions of people are newly eligible to receive a booster shot and will benefit from additional protection.

However, this action should not distract from the critical work of ensuring that unvaccinated people take the first step and get an initial COVID-19 vaccine.

More than 65 million Americans remain unvaccinated, leaving themselves – and their children, families, loved ones, and communities – vulnerable.






