



Cases and Deaths in Vaccinated Missourians

What is a breakthrough infection? A breakthrough infection is a COVID-19 case that occurs in someone who is fully vaccinated, meaning 14 or more days after completing the recommended doses of an authorized vaccine.

This dashboard was last updated on 12/5/2021, with the most recent testing data (12/4/2021), vaccine data (12/3/2021), and breakthrough data (12/3/2021). Breakthrough case and death data will be updated Monday through Friday, all other data will be updated daily. All metrics below include reported cases and deaths since 1/1/2021.





OMICRON VARIANT B.1.1.529

SARS-CoV-2 variant, B.1.1.529, now named Omicron, was first detected in specimens collected on November 11, 2021 in Botswana and on November 14, 2021 in South Africa.

On November 26, 2021, WHO named the virus Omicron and classified it as a Variant of Concern (VOC).

On November 30, 2021, the United States designated Omicron as a Variant of Concern


On December 1, 2021 the first confirmed U.S. case of Omicron was identified.

On December 3, 2021, the first confirmed Missouri case of Omicron was identified.

Despite the increased attention of the Omicron Variant, the Delta variant continues to be the main variant circulating in the U.S.

Where has Omicron been Detected in the United States

CDC is working with state and local public health officials to monitor the spread of Omicron. This map shows the states that have detected at least one case of COVID-19 illness caused by the Omicron variant. Omicron will be included in variant surveillance data on CDC's COVID Data Tracker when it can be reliably estimated at a low frequency.



Missouri Expands Eligibility for COVID-19 Booster Shots

- •Those who are 18 or older & fully vaccinated against COVID-19 are eligible for a booster shot:
 - At least 2 months after a 1-dose vaccine of Johnson & Johnson, or
 - At least 6 months after a 2-dose vaccine of Pfizer or Moderna.

Research shows that all COVID-19 vaccines authorized in the United States continue to be highly effective at preventing severe illness and death.






